Pope Gregory III designated November 1 to honor all saints. Soon All Saints Day incorporated some of the traditions of Samhain. The evening before was known as All Hallows Eve, and later Halloween.

Make a Plan to Vote in the November Presidential Election

Virginia has made changes to make it easier to vote by mail or in person.



Options:

1. *Absentee Ballots*
 - No excuse!
 - No witness needed!
 - No postage if you mail it!
 - Mail early. Must be postmarked by November 3
2. *Drop Off Your Ballot (September 18 – October 31)*
 - First floor Norfolk City Hall
 - Pretlow Library Satellite Voting Center (Dates & times to be announced.)
 - 2nd Presbyterian Church – on Election Day (November 3) only
3. *Vote In Person Before November 3*
 - Through October 31 (M-F & Saturday on October 24 & 31)
 - First floor Norfolk City Hall (8:30-5)
 - Pretlow Library or Lamberts Point Rec are satellite voting centers (varied times and dates)
 - Ends October 31
4. *Vote In Person on November 3*
 - 2nd Presbyterian Church
 - 6 AM – 7 PM
